Pathways Community Resource Guide

Purpose

The **Pathways** program was developed by the Augusta County Commonwealth Attorney's Office to address the high prevalence of individuals with significant mental health and/or substance use disorders who impact local law enforcement officers and the judicial system. Through *deflection* (a referral with no legal charges) or *diversion* (a referral to treatment services in lieu of filing or prosecuting criminal charges), **Pathways** becomes a compassionate alternative for individuals experiencing recurring crises, or those facing criminal prosecution, fines, and/or possible incarceration. These individuals may be new to, or frequently find themselves involved with, the criminal justice system. This community resource guide is a tool utilized by Pathways Case Managers to refer and link participants to services that can move them along their unique pathway to recovery and restoration.

Description

The Pathways Community Resource Guide is a comprehensive, information-packed resource guide that can be utilized by other community service providers to help create and facilitate more complete service plans for clients. It was developed for the purpose of promoting better collaboration and cooperation among community service providers. Let's be honest, no provider, or agency, can provide for all the needs that most clients present with, so the **Pathways Community Resource Guide** helps us all to work together on behalf of our clients.

Program Description

Pathways is a two-track (6-month and 12-month options), three-phase restorative program that allows the individual to engage in a variety of community services to assist them in developing their own unique pathway to recovery from mental illness, substance abuse, or a combination of both (i.e., cooccurring disorders). The process begins with a referral from a community service provider (e.g., hospital ER, law enforcement officer, primary care physician, EMT, etc.). And once an individual contacts Pathways, they are scheduled for a program screening and evaluation. This assessment can typically occur within 24-hours, but with a goal of scheduling it within no more than 72 hours of the crisis event or initial contact. **Engagement timeliness is one of the most critical elements in the treatment process so we try to steer our participants towards service providers who can see them quickly.**

If the individual is accepted into the Pathways Program, they are assigned a case manager, at no cost to the individual, who will then assist them in identifying any additional service needs (e.g., housing, food assistance, eligibility for other benefits programs, transportation, etc.) and also help link the individual to those service providers within our community. Rarely does a struggling person have a single, unmet need. More often,



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they are simply unaware of services available within our community, or too overwhelmed to seek them out on their own. Navigating the web of community service agencies can be overwhelming and especially so when someone is in crisis.

The Pathways Program is voluntary, but it requires a firm commitment from the participant and also those in his/her support system. In the absence of a strong support system, program staff (i.e., Case Managers and Peer Recovery Support Specialists), other participants, and other agencies will assist the

individual in creating one. We believe having a natural support system is a crucial element necessary for sustained recovery. Recovery from mental illness and/or substance abuse is a difficult process. Substance abuse recovery requires more than just abstinence; the individual must develop a sound recovery plan, have resources and the commitment to implement the plan, and constantly make necessary adjustments along the way.

Program graduates will be celebrated. Having met the requirements of the Pathways Program, they *graduate* during a ceremony where key individuals, including supportive family and friends, law enforcement officer(s), judicial system personnel (I.e., Commonwealth Attorney, Assistant Commonwealth Attorney, investigators, other law enforcement personnel), attend to acknowledge the hard work, commitment, and effort the participant has invested in changing their life path.

Staff

Pathways staff include a Program Manager, members of the Augusta Commonwealth Attorney's Office team, Case Managers, and Peer Recovery Support Specialists (PRSS). We believe collaboration, cooperation, and compassion are critical to the growth and sustained recovery of individuals.

Time Required

Pathways has two tracks – a 6-month and 12-month program. There are three phases within each track with specific milestones to be achieved during each phase. During the 12-month track, it generally takes four months to advance through each program phase. Requirements typically include community service in the form of the Litter Control Program (LCP) participation. This requires program participants to provide 8 hours per month of litter pick-up in our community. Participants are also required to meet with their case manager weekly during the initial phase of being in Pathways; the frequency decreases as one progresses through the phases. Routine and random Urine Drug Screenings (UDS) and/or oral swabs may be required depending upon the results of the intake screening and assessment. Participants are required to attend a peer support session monthly; these can be in-person or virtual depending upon the participant's program phase. While not required, we offer a monthly Family & Friends Support Group to the loved ones of the participant or someone these group members would like to see enrolled in our program. Family & Friends Support Group addresses healthier ways to help a loved one by avoiding enabling behaviors. It also provides group



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members with peers in similar situations to talk about their concerns at any time. Other requirements are dependent upon the assessed needs of each individual at the time of intake and as they progress in the process. Some goals and objectives cited on the participant's recovery plan are not required, only recommended, for successful completion of the Pathways Program. Pathways requires a genuine commitment from the participant, both in their time and the alternative life-decisions they choose to make.

Additional Resources

This brings us to resources. Oftentimes, an individual is simply unaware of the resources available within their own community, too impaired to pursue what they need, or at a loss about how to actually proceed to access any resource they may qualify for. This Community Resource Guide was developed to assist Pathways Case Managers with identifying local community resources that could help our participants in their unique *journey to restoration*.

This guide will be published (hard copy) annually and updated (electronic version) regularly by Pathways staff and interns. The listings found within are categorized consistent with the service categories found in the **Unite Us** online service providers platform (<https://app.auth.uniteus.io/>).
